

2011 Clinical Research Fellowship Position Listings

The Center for Clinical Studies in Houston, Texas has availability for 3 clinical research fellows, starting July 1, 2011.

Location: Center for Clinical Studies, Houston, TX
Program Director: Stephen K. Tyring, MD, PhD, MBA

The fellows will be involved in a variety of clinical research projects involving the treatment of psoriasis, atopic dermatitis, acne, herpes zoster, herpes genitalis, HPV and cutaneous infections as well as vaccines for prevention of a number of skin diseases.

The clinical research fellows will have the opportunities to publish and present at local and national meetings as well as to collaborate with scientists in Dr. Tyring's viral immunology laboratory in the Department of Dermatology at the University of Texas Health Science Center (UTHSC), Houston. The fellows will also have opportunities to work with Dr. Tyring and Dr. Karan Sra in their private clinic caring for a variety of dermatological problems as well as learning basic dermatological surgery techniques. Fellows may attend local meetings such as the combined University of Texas Houston/ Baylor School of Medicine Dermatology Rounds, The Houston Dermatological Society, etc. as well as national meetings, e.g. the American Academy of Dermatology annual meeting.

Since 1991, a total of 32 clinical research fellows have completed one or two years of training with Dr. Tyring; 31 of the physicians have gone onto dermatology residency after the training.

Requirements: The applicant should have completed a minimum of PGY1 and must be eligible to obtain a Texas medical license.

Open Position for 2011 - Dermatopathology Fellowship at Saint Louis University

The Saint Louis University Department of Dermatology is accepting applications for a 1 year Dermatopathology Fellowship to begin July 1, 2011.

The Dermatopathology Fellowship is an ACGME-accredited one-year fellowship program (program # 1002812088) sponsored by the Department of Dermatology. The director is M. Yadira Hurley, MD. The fellowship is open to physicians who have completed a residency in either dermatology or pathology and is designed to train individuals to function as independent dermatopathologists.

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The Saint Louis University Division of Dermatopathology in the Department of Dermatology has a history that dates back to the formal beginnings of the Department in 1992. All three faculty in the Division of Dermatopathology are board certified in both dermatology and dermatopathology and have diverse interests. The program provides training in morphologic evaluation of inflammatory skin disease and cutaneous neoplasms, use of histochemical and immunohistochemical stains, and evaluation of direct immunofluorescence specimens. The dermatopathology specimen caseload for the fellowship includes approximately 24,000 routine dermatopathology surgical specimens, 1,000 consult specimens, and 200 direct immunofluorescence skin specimens. The program also provides the opportunity for instruction in interpretation of frozen and permanent Mohs micrographic surgery specimens. Rotations to evaluate electron microscopy are also available. For dermatologists, the fellowship involves six months of surgical pathology training in the Saint Louis University Department of Pathology. Pathology trained fellows will participate in clinics in the Department of Dermatology completing the six-month clinical requirement with an emphasis in clinicopathologic correlations. Research in either the Department of Dermatology or Department of Pathology is strongly encouraged. The fellow will have an active role in teaching medical students and residents and will participate in didactic conferences as appropriate to previous residency training.

Requirements:

Applicants must have completed a residency in dermatology or pathology at an ACGME accredited program and be board certified or board eligible in their respective specialty. Applicants must be licensed in Missouri or be eligible to obtain a Missouri medical license.

MELANOMA AND CUTANEOUS ONCOLOGY FELLOWSHIP

We have a position available for a Melanoma Fellow at the Washington Cancer Institute, Washington Hospital Center in Washington, DC, starting July 1, 2011. We have a multi-disciplinary pigmented lesion clinic at the Washington Cancer Institute, headed by dermatologists, Dr. Suraj Venna and Dr. Gary Peck. Duties include working with dermatologists, surgical oncologists, oncologists, and other specialists to coordinate the care of patients who have or are at risk for melanoma. The fellow will have the opportunity to conduct clinical research and is encouraged to present their research project(s) at conferences which will be paid by the institution. In addition, the fellow will have close contact with the Department of Dermatology and actively participate in resident clinics, book review, journal club, and other academic activities. This is a 2-year position. However, a 1-year possibility may exist depending on the prior training of the applicant.

Applicants must have completed a minimum of PGY-1 and must be eligible to obtain a Washington, DC medical license. Salary and benefits are will be commensurate with PGY status.

Duke University Medical Center is offering a one to two year melanocytic neoplasms fellowship with Dr. Kelly Nelson.

The fellowship would offer training in the clinical evaluation and management of patients with high-risk melanocytic neoplasms, including the utilization of total body photography, dermoscopy, and reflectance confocal microscopy. Fellows will also have the opportunity to participate in a strong multidisciplinary melanoma program, with exposure to research projects leveraging dermatopathology and surgical oncology collaboration. Fellows will manage several retrospective database studies and prospective reflectance confocal imaging studies.
