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Why you need to use it!

- ◆ Program
 - ◆ Find strengths in training
 - ◆ Develop new best practices for prescribing
 - ◆ Find gaps in training
 - ◆ Before they are pointed out to you
 - ◆ Milestones

Why you need to make them use it!

◆ Resident

- ◆ Improve clinical care
- ◆ Formal method to track proficiency in medication management
- ◆ Find strengths and gaps in training
- ◆ Increasing requests for medical case logs for hospital privileges

Northwestern Derm

- ◆ Attending-driven clinics
- ◆ Once weekly resident-run continuity clinics
 - ◆ VA
 - ◆ NMFF
 - ◆ Lurie Children's
- ◆ MDCL utilized in continuity clinics only
 - ◆ Goal to record 1-2 patients per clinic
 - ◆ Reach 50-75 patients per year!

Obstacles to Use

- ◆ “Takes too long in clinic”
- ◆ “Not prescribing a medication today”
- ◆ “May not see the patient again”
- ◆ “Don’t know how to use the application”
- ◆ “Where is my ID and password”
- ◆ “How does it help me?”

“Takes too long in clinic”

- ◆ FREE iPhone and Android Mobile Apps available
- ◆ Takes 30-60 seconds to input

- ◆ WEB: www.meddermlogs.com
- ◆ MOBILE: <http://meddermlogs.com/mobile/>

- ◆ Easily input a patient while waiting to present to an attending physician

“I am not prescribing a medication today”

- ◆ May choose “Other” or “No Meds” from the drop down list of medications
- ◆ May change to relevant prescribed systemic medication in the future
- ◆ Allows to track patients from either initial discussion of systemic medications or transition from topical to systemic medications

“I may not see the patient again”

- ◆ Enroll patients from continuity clinic
- ◆ May help with followup when patient reviews MDCL semi-annually

“I don't know how to use the application”

- ◆ Suggest a 15 minute tutorial at the beginning of each academic year during orientation
- ◆ Program coordinator and/or chief residents can go over web and mobile application
- ◆ Short web-based video tutorials available online
- ◆ It is easy – I can do it!
- ◆ Buy in from program directors – please!

“Where is my password?”

- ◆ Native self-management tool through which new accounts can be created
- ◆ Old passwords can be retrieved on-line
- ◆ Recommend having the program coordinator to keep master list of all passwords

“How does it help me?”

- ◆ Improve clinical care
- ◆ Formal method to track experience in medication management
- ◆ Find strengths and gaps in training
- ◆ Allow program director to support documentation of proficiency in medical management (for reference letters, hospital privileges, licensure)
- ◆ Increasing requests for medical case logs for hospital privileges

MDCL in your program

- ◆ Can be easily integrated into all program models
 - ◆ Resident or attending-led clinics
 - ◆ Continuity clinics
- ◆ May vary by residency class
- ◆ Can choose which medications you would like to track
