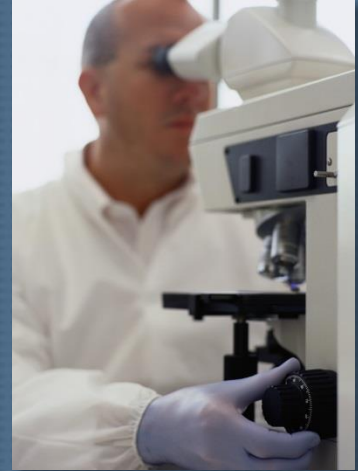
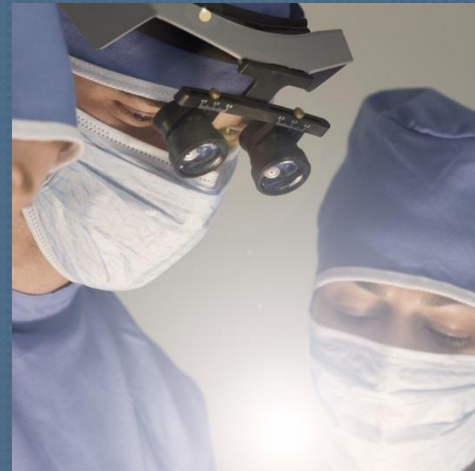

50 Years of Service to the Specialty

- Founders' Vision: An organization of dermatologists supporting the growth of the specialty
- For five decades, the DF has identified and launched the careers of promising new teachers & investigators
 - 80% of CDA recipients have remained in academics
 - 86% of these have obtained federal funding
- \$70 million allocated to research
 - 1,100 award recipients
 - Nearly 350 career development awardees



2015 Research Awards: \$3.1 Million

- **Career Development Awards**

- \$55,000/year for 3 years
- 45 awarded in 2015

- **Fellowships**

- \$30,000 - \$45,000/year
- 6 awarded in 2015

- **Grants**

- \$20,000/year
- 6 awarded in 2015



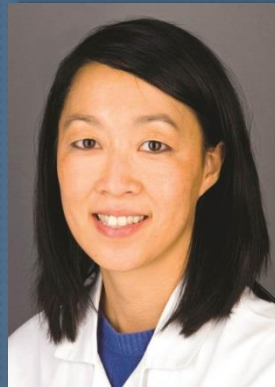
Charles & Daneen Stiefel Scholar Award
