Osteopathic Program Transition Considerations

- 2017: last class to be entered into AOCD approved residencies
- Only a fraction of current AOCD residencies will likely apply for ACG^{NS2} approval
- AOCD's AOBD will continue to provide certifying exam and certification for a while
- AOCD's Educatio

 Evaluation Committee will
 fold after 2020

- ACGME Derm RRC will review new applications for residencies that were AOA approved
- A small fraction of these will apply for Osteopathic Recognition (Osteopathic Principles & Practice taught & assessed)
- DO's in ACGME residencies remain eligible for AOCD's AOBD certifying exam (not reciprocal)

Process for ACGME Osteopathic Recognition Committee Approval for UH/CWRU Program

AOA/AOCD

- Functionally dually accredited
- Maintain AOA/AOCD accreditation
- For applicants:
 - Provides eligibility for AOA match in 2016-17
- For Residents:
 - Provides eligibility for AOA/AOCD Certification exam
 - Provides membership and engagement in AOCD

ACGME/Derm RRC

- Functionally dually accredited
- Formalized plan for OPP integration
- Applied via ADS for Osteopathic Recognition; approved 2016
- Local GMEC approved plan
- Update ADS: major change notification
- Awaiting RRC review of notification
- Osteopathic-Focused Track designation
- NRMP match into Track

Implications for APD

- What is the best way for APD to reach out and engage transitioning Osteopathic Dermatology educators?
- Does APD need some specific programming or workshops to specifically enable transitioned DO faculty educators?
- How do we leverage the unique contributions that DO training brings to medicine?

- If only a fraction of AOA programs transition or merge into ACGME programs, are there dermatology workforce implications?
- If so, how will we quantitate and anticipate the long range impact of a significant reduction in dermatology graduates?
- (if reduce by half: 120/2=60 fewer; over 10 years this could be ~600 fewer Derms; if 1 derm/30,000 people, this would be like adding 18M people w/o any additional derms)
